2009-2010 School Profile

Community

Encompassing 102.27 square miles, located in southeastern Illinois along the Wabash River and our neighboring state of Indiana, Hutsonville Community Unit School District #1 serves the students of the communities of Hutsonville, Annapolis, West Union, West York, and York. The district operates Hutsonville Elementary School (Pre-K - 5), Hutsonville Junior High School (6-8), and Hutsonville High School (9-12). Demographically, the district's enrollment of 399 students is 97.7% White, 1.5% Multiracial, 0.5% Hispanic, and 0.3% Asian. The district has a low income rate of 41.9% and a mobility rate of 16.4%.

School

Hutsonville High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 126 students in grades 9 through 12. The school was organized into its current structure in 1950, but graduated its first class back in the 1890s. HHS is fully accredited by the Illinois State Board of Education and has been recognized for excellence by ISBE and in the national publication, *Activity*, published by ACT, Inc.

Curriculum

The academic program is organized in a traditional eight-period schedule, with 45 minute class periods and four minute passing periods. Students typically attend six classes (a combination of academic and vocational), one period of Physical Education, and one period of study hall. Due to our small size, we do not offer AP, IB, or Honors classes. Vocational classes are offered on campus for all students and also through Twin Rivers CTE for juniors and seniors who wish to pursue further vocational study in the areas of Auto Mechanics, Child Care, Construction Trades, Health Occupations, Horticulture, and Welding. Juniors and seniors have the opportunity to earn a multitude of both Dual Credit and Dual Enrollment credits through Lincoln Trail College, Olney Central College, and Wabash Valley College. Additionally, HHS is one of a handful of high schools to offer students the opportunity to earn MOUS Certification by Microsoft Corporation as Office User Specialists.

Graduation Requirements

24 credits and eight semesters of attendance are required for graduation. Most courses earn one-half

credit per semester. Specific graduation requirements are as follows:

Four credits in English taken from the following English courses: English I, English II, Applied Communications I, English III, Applied Communications II, and English IV

Three credits in Mathematics (with a minimum of Geometry required for graduation)

Two credits in Science

Two and one-half credits in Social Science including: World Geography, United States History, and American Government

One-half credit in Health

One credit in Physical Education (1/4 credit awarded per school year)

One-half credit in Fine Arts Survey

One-half credit in Workplace Readiness

One-half credit in Resource Management

One-half credit in Speech Communications

One credit in any combination of vocational education, music, art, or foreign language

Grading, Ranking, and GPA

A (Excellent) 90-100; B (Above Average) 80-89;

C (Average) 70-79; D (Below Average) 60-69;

F (Failure) 59-0

Rankings are based on grade point average and are updated at the end of every semester. GPA is calculated on a 4.0 scale (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0)
